SHODŌ (CALLIGRAPHY) PRESENTATION (11:05 - 11:35)

Kyoko Fujii, a professional shodō artist, will present a large-scale demonstration of the fine art of Japanese calligraphy.

CHILD'S KIMONO PRESENTATION (11:40 - 12:40 AND 1:55 - 2:55)

Members of the JSD Women's Club will select two young girls (ideally ~4' tall) from each presentation to be dressed in kimono. Narration will accompany the demonstration.

CHANOYU (TEA CEREMONY) PRESENTATION (12:45 - 1:15 AND 2:55 - 3:25)

The tea practitioners of the JSD Women's Club will demonstrate the beauty, simplicity and tranquility of the Japanese tradition of *chanoyu*. Commentary will be provided.

ORIGAMI PRESENTATION (1:20 - 1:50)

Origami artist, Stacie Tamaki, will introduce the art of Japanese paper folding, and discuss her specialty - miniature origami. She will also lead the audience in folding a paper swan to take home.

KOTO PERFORMANCE (3:30 - 4:00)

The Miyabi Ensemble will perform two melodies on the *koto* – the classic *Chidori-no-Kyoku* (Song of the Sea Plovers), and the more contemporary *Hana-Ikada* (Rafts of Flower Petals).
